43/04 MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

The minutes of the previous meeting were agreed. Chairman to sign and bring signed copy to next meeting for the records.

44/04 MATTERS ARISING

Chairman apologised for his absence from the previous meeting, pressure of work had necessitated him being absent at short notice. 45/04 CORRESPONDENCES

46/04 TREASURERS REPORT

Marshall Lawton noted that there was no real change to the monetary status of the associations account since the last meeting. The deposit account was standing @ £4029, whilst the current account was sitting @ £2632 (both amount approximate for the purpose of the minutes). Three individual cheques were raised to clear outstanding invoices for committee members expenses. Mashall commented on the excellent work which Mrs Anne Shave had put in collecting advertisers monies, in as much that there was only one advertiser who was delaying on payment. Good work Anne!
